a. Letter from the Board President of West Valley Central School – President Calarco stated that it was good to hear that West Valley is happy to consider working with ECS.

Informational Items

a. Capital Project – Discovered an area in the Business Office and Superintendent's Office that should have been sealed off and is not. The offices are extremely cold. Buildings and Grounds Committee is invited to next Capital Project Meeting on December 9th at 10:00 am.

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b. Strategic Planning Meeting: Thursday, November 20, 2014 @ 7:00 pm in the High School Cafeteria: Superintendent Ward stated that he would like to see a good turn out. Mrs. Poulin will lead the charge again with this plan (as she did with the last in 2009). He stated that the committee will look at the strengths and weaknesses of the district. Superintendent Ward encouraged Board Members to invite others to the meeting. Nicole Klein asked if community members were targeted to be members. Superintendent Ward stated yes. He added that students will be asked to participate, especially Student Council Members (particularly, the President, Connor Schmick). Superintendent Ward stated that he feels confident that the administrators can facilitate the strategic planning process and sees no need to hire an outside agency. He said this will save the district money.

Superintendent's Report

- **a.** December 9th Board Meeting –will ask board members to take a look at the Child Nutrition Agreement and review the new plan. It will need board approval as well.
- **b.** Mr. Miller will report on sports and music in his report.
- **c.** Sports Banquet for Boy's and Girl's soccer was held on Sunday, November 16th. Coaches picked the date and the format of the evening. Desserts were served instead of a sit-down dinner.
- **d.** Afterschool Programming Superintendent Ward stated that he is recommending expanding the afterschool programs for students. He would like to recommend a program 2 nights a week for K, 1, and 2 students (recommended by teachers) to work on I-Ready. He also would like a program 2 nights a week for 7th & 8th grade students. Mr. Miller & Mrs. Poulin will speak with their staff at their faculty meetings on Wednesday regarding the additions. The estimated cost would be around \$13,000 for the year with an anticipated start date of early January. The expansion will add another day to the late bus schedule with it going from 2 days a week to 3 days a week. President Calarco stated that he felt this was where the district should be spending money, on the students academics. The Board gave Superintendent Ward permission to move ahead with plans for the programs.

Discussion Items a.

Small Capital Project – possible January 2015 Vote: Enclose vestibule entrance (south). This was cut from the original Capital Project because of funding. An upgraded sound system for the multi-use facility (gym & music), and new roofing for 2 areas of the school. Superintendent Ward suggested an \$895,000 project, but there must also be money for financial and professional fees. He added that he hopes the interest rates will stay around 3% or lower. Superintendent Ward also stated that the original project bids came in much higher than anyone could have predicted, mainly due to the building boom in Buffalo. The cost of the new project would be at an estimated cost of \$34,000-\$35,000 per year. He stated that while there is an impact on taxes it is small. President Calarco stated that the south entrance was a key component of the current project and the roofs have to be fixed one way or another. By putting it in a project the district can receive State Aid. Bill Murphy stated he felt \$925,000 was a good number. President Calarco polled members of the board and they agreed to a \$925,000 capital project. Nicole Klein stated she felt it was very important to educate the public on the need for this project. Superintendent Ward stated that he would encourage residents to come down to the school and see what the board is talking about for this project.
