I am pleased and excited to let you know that the updates to our security system are almost complete. All the cameras have been installed and activated, and the software is up and running. The video clarity these cameras provide is incredible and much more advanced than our old system. The ability to zoom in with these cameras, whether it is a live stream or a recording, will greatly assist us when we need to use the cameras in a variety of situations.

The new entrance cameras are also a great improvement. We can now very clearly see who is requesting entry into the building and communicate with that person via the connected intercom. We are still working through a few issues with the doors themselves and respectfully request your patience if a door does not open immediately when you are requesting access. We anticipate having these kinks worked out in the near future. We also will be putting updated signage by these entrance points for guests' convenience.




