## Second Grade STEM Instruction

Students in Mrs. Farnum's class have been busy the last few months engaging in STEM activities. (STEM stands for science, technology, engineering, math). STEM instruction is pivotal in the classroom to not only spark students' interest in computer sciences, but to also increase their ability to think critically about a problem. STEM-based lessons not only teach students science and math concepts but focus on hands-on learning that are related to the real world. Each week, students are read a story and are then given a challenge to complete. Using problem solving skills and critical thinking skills, students work together to come up with a solution.

In September, students learned how to code (given a set of directions) to a Botley classroom robot. After reading "Hardly Haunted," they were challenged to program the Botley accurately so that it could "ring a doorbell on a Haunted House" (program the Botley to touch a glue stick without knocking it over). They also read the story "Big Truck Little Island," a true story about teamwork and creative thinking. After reading this

story, they utilized STEM kits from the Hess company to learn how tow trucks move vehicles from one place to another.

In October, students were challenged to use their math skills to correctly identify given geometric shapes. They used another student robot, called BeeBot, to showcase their geometry knowledge. They also used Beebot to navigate through student-built mazes after reading "Pig the Monster."

November brought possibly the most difficult task yet. After reading "Balloons Over Broadway" students created their own Thanksgiving Day balloon "floats" and affixed them to a Dash Robot. Students programed the Dash robots to create a 2nd Grade Thanksgiving Day Parade.

This group of 2nd graders is full of computer scientists and engineers. They are hardworking individuals excited to meet any new challenge presented to them. The future is indeed looking bright!
