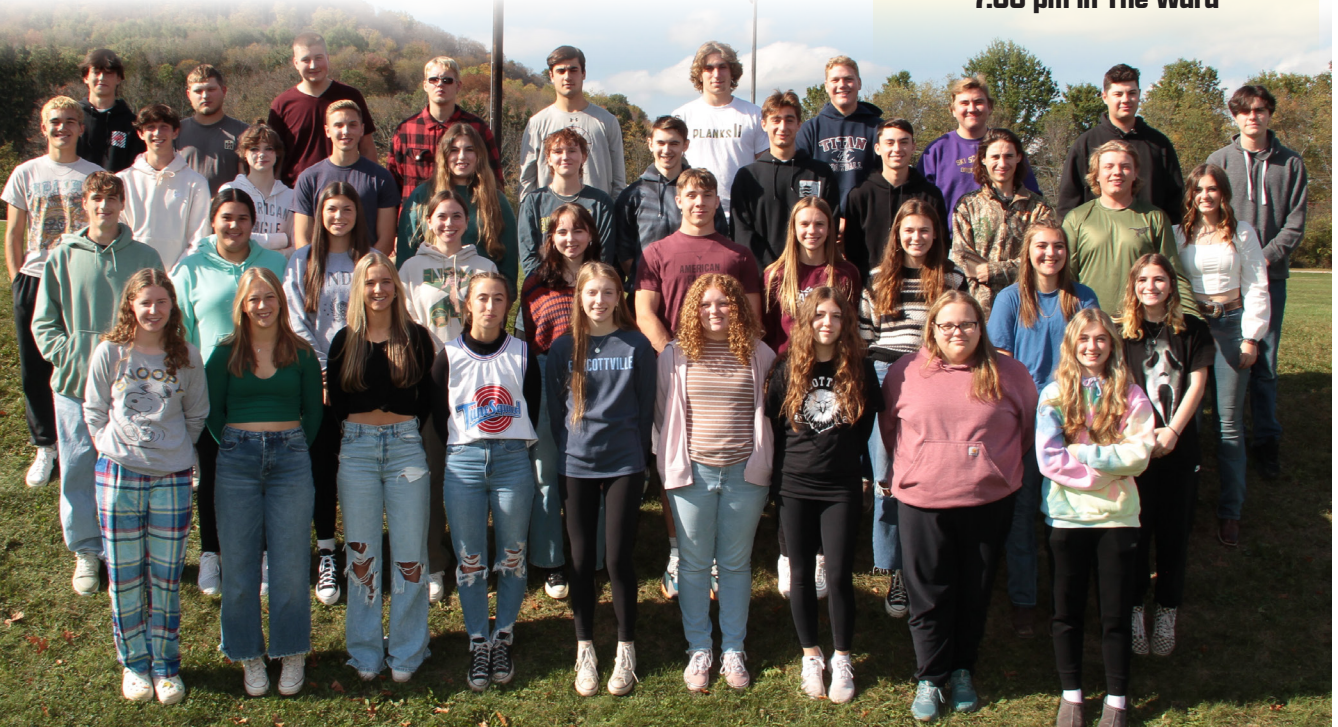

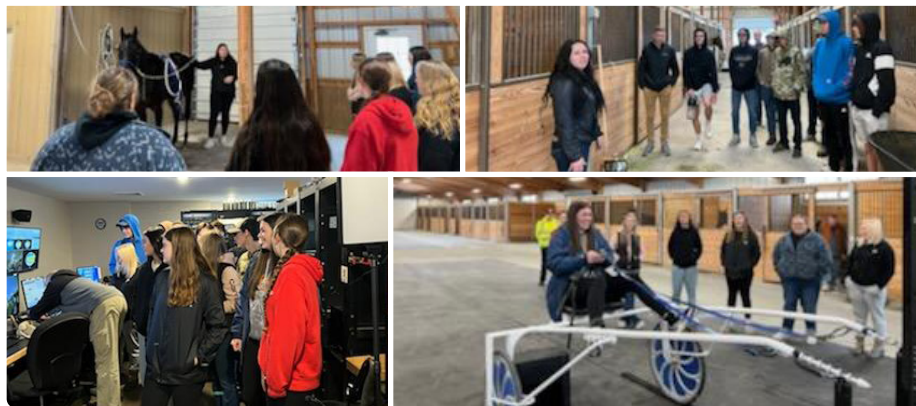
## SPORT CLASSES FRIENDLY COMPETITION

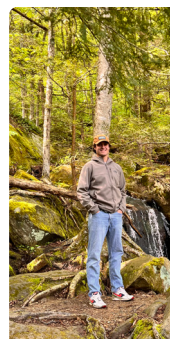


## NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY WELCOMES NEW INDUCTEES

### **BASIC BUDGET - Proposition #1**
