Heading Back to School!

I hope this newsletter finds everyone well rested from the summer and ready for another exciting school year at ECS!

While the 2021-22 school year will start out differently than the traditional year, we also anticipate being able to return to instruction and offer students more opportunities throughout the year. At the time of publication, the District is still pulling together its final Reopening Plans. Once these plans are finalized we will send a detailed summary to each family and post both the detailed summary and full plan on line. While these plans are still being completed and details being determined, I am able to share some good news to get things started:

- ★ We are planning on all students attending <u>in-person</u>, <u>full days</u>, <u>every day</u>. No hybrid learning models are being planned at this time!
- ★ We will be able to transport more students on each bus this year, and, therefore will return to **just one run** in the AM and one in the PM.
- ★ Fall Sports will be back following a more "normal" schedule and allow for spectators.
- ★ ALL STAFF have been dedicated and are working hard to ensure the success of students. From curriculum planning to cleaning to maintenance on the bus fleet to work in the offices... everyone is pitching in to provide the best educational opportunities available to the students of ECS.

We also have a number of exciting things taking place within the District in addition to the general reopening plans. Two (2) such items are:

• Capital Project – It has been an incredibly busy summer here on campus. From obvious exterior work such as the parking lots/bus loops, drainage system and athletic fields to the indoor (and less obvious) work such as the new elementary gym floor, rebuilt MS/HS kitchen and security system upgrades, it has been fun to watch the progress. There is still a great deal of work to be done this summer before school starts, and it will continue after the school year begins... just in less obvious places. At times, it has been frustrating. It seems if we



are not being delayed by the rain, then we are experiencing backorders on materials and/or supplies. In addition, we will be moving some items to next summer, as there simply is not enough time to complete everything this year and/or we need to be able to complete the work when the building is not occupied by students. I would also like to thank everyone for their tremendous patience this summer as the construction took place. The added noise, different parking arrangements. and daily changes in access points were all handled in stride by staff; making for a successful summer.

- Grants We have completed the application process for two federal grants (CRRSA and FCC Connectivity), will complete an application by the end of the summer for a third federal grant (ARP), and plan on seeking funds through CCDOH for additional portable air filtration systems. Collectively, these grants will allow for items / activities such as:
 - ♦ Additional staff
 - ♦ Additional technology (laptop computers and iPad accessories)
 - PPE (purchase and/or reimbursement)
 - Expanded afterschool activities to address learning loss
 - Programs designed to assist students with Social Emotional Learning / Wellbeing
 - ♦ Enhanced Staff Development
 - ♦ Etc.

As we move forward into the year, please keep in mind that the guidance on reopening is fluid and ever changing. New medical information, updated guidance, increase/decrease in community transmission rates, etc. will intertwine throughout the year and impact what we may be able to do. I ask that you continue to be patient as we work together on plans. These many moving parts are connected, and changing items in one part of the guidance or plan affects other parts of the guidance or plan. You have all been patient since March of 2019 as we have worked through the COVID-19 Pandemic, and I'm asking that you please continue to be patient as we move forward.

Just like last year, I have no doubt that the entire community will continue working together for the students of ECS. Support for the students and their education at ECS has always been one of the strongest traditions at ECS. As we look to turn the corner on the COVID-19 Pandemic, this support is shining through brighter and stronger than ever! On behalf of the District and, more importantly, the students... THANK YOU!!!! I know that as a team, the entire ECS community will work together to ensure the continued safety and success of our students!

ECS Launches New Mobile App



Improved and More Efficient Communication With All Parents

This year, ECS will be improving the ways in which we can quickly and more efficiently communicate with all parents. This will occur through our new mobile app designed for schools. The new ECS mobile app is available for both Apple and Android devices. We will use the app to not only make "robo-calls" and post notifications, it will also send e-mails and text messages, while posting the same information to our website and Facebook, page.

At the current time, by default, the app will automatically send phone calls and e-mails to parents based on the information we have on file in Power School. In addition, the District has the ability to send text messages, and will most likely include text messages in the majority of communications. Text messages will also be sent out based on information in Power School. (If you do not want to receive text messages all you need to do is reply to the text with the message STOP.) Please remember, the District's ability to get messages to you via this system depends on accuracy of the information in Power School. Should any of your information change, please contact the school immediately to have the information updated.

The mobile app will allow for enhanced communication, as well as, access to additional information from the school. The app is **FREE** and available for download today:

- 2. Search Ellicottville Central Schools
- 3. Then select the Ellicottville Central Schools app for free download

While we are encouraging everyone to download the app, please note, you do not need to download the app to your phone to receive general and emergency communications. You only need the app if you would like additional control on receiving notifications as well as access to more school information. Currently, as we are learning how to work with this system, you may find information on the mobile app somewhat limited. Our intent is to increase the amount of information that will be shared via the app as we move through the school year.

ECS currently utilizes Pick-up Patrol as our transportation/arrival/dismissal platform. The tutorial will provide directions on how to save a shortcut to Pick-up Patrol on your electronic device making access and plan changes quick and easy. Pickup Patrol will be used for parents to upload arrival/dismissal information as well as information related to student absences.

"DON'T LOSE YOUR RIDING PRIVILEGE!"

- 1. Be on time for pick ups/drop offs.
- 2. Do not enter or leave the bus while it is in motion.
- 3. Always pass in front of the bus, never behind, when loading or unloading from the bus.
- 4. Occupy the seat assigned by the driver or monitor.
- 5. Remain seated until the bus has reached your destination.
- 6. Head or arms must not be extended from the windows.
- 7. Students will not throw any objects from the bus.
- 8. Large objects may not be carried on the bus due to D.O.T. regulations.
- 9. The bus driver and/or the monitor are to be obeyed at all times. Riding the bus is a privilege and drivers are instructed to report students who do not obey these rules.
- 10. Drinking, eating, cursing, swearing or loud talking are prohibited.
- 11. Please refrain from driving your car or parking in the bus circle during the hours of: 7:45 am to 8:05 am and 2:45 pm to 3:05 pm.

BUS TRAFFIC INFORMATION

Traffic will NOT be permitted anywhere in front of the school while buses are in the loop. It is against the law to pass any school bus that is stopped and has its red lights flashing. Yield to buses in the parking lot and driveways.

- The morning buses arrive at 7:45 until approx. 8:05 AM.
- The afternoon buses arrive at 2:45 until approx. 3:05 PM.
- The late buses arrive at 3:50 until approx. 4:05 PM.

MIDDLE/HIGH SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION PROCEDURES

- 1. The preferred arrival time for students being driven to school is after 8:00 AM. Students must report to the cafeteria.
- 2. You may enter and exit the Middle/High drive after dropping off your child(ren).

LATE BUS SCHEDULE

We anticipate (because of COVID) late buses will begin running at 4:00 PM on MONDAYS, TUESDAYS, and WEDNESDAYS in OCTOBER through the end of MAY.

These buses are for students who are involved with homework club, school clubs, review classes, computer lab time, students receiving detention, and some sports teams.

There will be a north run (Ellicottville-Mansfield) and a south run (Great Valley-Humphrey area) that will cover most areas of our school district.

ELEMENTARY CAR RIDER DROP-OFF PROCEDURES

- 1. The preferred arrival time for student(s) being driven to school is after 8:00 AM.
- 2. Cars will enter the elementary entrance and proceed up the car line route to the designated drop-off point.
- 3. Any overflow cars should loop through the elementary parking lot and are **prohibited from double parking in the entrance** lane or on the lawn.
- 4. Once the car rider lane has stopped moving, cars that are parked adjacent to the sidewalk may allow their children to safely exit and walk to the elementary entrance.
- 5. As cars leave the drop-off line we ask that you pull up behind the car in front of you and stay in the line until your child has left the vehicle and is walking to school.
- 6. We ask that parents remain in their car when dropping off
- 7. Once students have safely exited the vehicle, cars may depart by making a left on to the front drive of the school and exit the driveway at the south end near the high school.
- 8. We ask that all students practice social distancing when leaving their car while walking up to the entrance of the school.

ELEMENTARY CAR RIDER PICK-UP PROCEDURES

- 1. The preferred pick-up time for students is 2:45-3:00 PM.
- 2. Cars may enter via the elementary entrance and proceed up the car line route to the designated drop off point.
- 3. Any overflow cars should loop through the elementary parking lot and are **prohibited from double parking in the entrance lane or on the lawn**.
- 4. Once the car line has stopped moving a staff member will approach your car to assist you with signing out your child.
- 5. As cars leave the pick-up line, we ask that you pull up behind the car in front of you and stay in the line until your child is safely in your vehicle.
- 6. Each family will be given a specialized sign with your child's name on it. In order to safely sign out your child, this sign needs to be shown to the staff member.
- 7. Staff members will communicate your arrival and will dismiss your child from the building.
- 8. Students will exit the elementary entrance always maintaining social distancing.
- 9. Parents are asked to remain in their cars at all times.
- 10. Cars may depart by making a left on to the front drive of the school and exit the driveway at the south end near the high school after your child is safely in the vehicle.

- State and federal laws protect the confidentiality of personally identifiable information and safeguards associated with industry standards and best practices, including but not limited to, encryption, firewalls and password protection, must be in place when data is stored or transferred.

Idling Buses on School Grounds

State law requires school districts to take steps to minimize the idling of the engines of school buses and other school vehicles on school grounds. While students are boarding and departing school buses, the engine should be turned off. Students should be instructed about the importance of getting on and off buses in an orderly and efficient fashion to minimize loading and offloading time. Bus engines should also be off while parked at sporting events and other school activities. Exceptions to this "no idling" policy can be made in cases of emergency, mechanical issues or for necessary heating.

Explaining The "BIG 4" Emergency Protocols

While ECS has a number of procedures to best ensure everyone's safety, we would like to share some important information on what we refer to as "The BIG 4 Emergency Protocols." These four protocols are: Shelter in Place, Lockdown, Lockout, and Evacuation. We cannot share the exact steps we take in each of these protocols, as doing so could compromise them, and ultimately our ability to best protect students and staff. We can, however, provide a brief overview of each protocol so you are better informed.

SAFETY MEASURES DEFINED:

- ▶ SHELTER IN PLACE: This is considered one of the least intrusive procedures. It is used to secure students safely in classes, and restrict movement in hallways and throughout the building. Examples of when this may be used include: a medical emergency in the building, overt disruption in hallway, or staging for possible transition to Lockout, Lockdown or Evacuation. A Shelter in Place not only secures students, it allows for time to assess a situation without taking too extreme a measure. During a Shelter in Place teachers and students may continue normal classroom activities behind closed and locked doors.
- ▶ LOCKOUT: This is considered a mid-level procedure. It is used when an actual or potential threat exists from outside the school building (Ex. Escaped fugitive, unusual disturbance in the parking lot or road, disgruntled employee or spouse, etc.). During a Lockout, all outside activities are cancelled and the exterior doors and windows are closed and locked. Once the building is secure, we may decide to allow normal activities within the school.

Please DO NOT call or drive to the school in the event of a Lockout, Evacuation or Lockdown.

- EVACUATION: This can be considered a mid-level procedure or a high level procedure based on the situation. Evacuating the building when a fire alarm sounds is something we have all learned do since we were little kids and is a straight forward procedure. When we need to evacuate and relocate to another location due to an imminent threat such as a bomb or chemical threat this is considered a high level procedure. Please know that should we need to evacuate to another location, we will notify parents that we are doing so, but for safety reasons we will not announce in advance where we are evacuating to.
- ▶ LOCKDOWN: This is considered our highest alert! A Lockdown is used when an actual or imminent threat exists and we need to immediately secure students. Examples of when this may be used include: a trespasser with a weapon is on campus, there is a hostage situation, or there is a riot. In a lockdown, students and staff are not only secured behind locked doors, they are to be out of sight and silent.

Please note that we:

- May employ more than one procedure at a time.
- May transition from one procedure to another.
- Will modify or "flex" a procedure if it is necessary.
- Will make our primary goal and focus the securing of students and staff to best ensure everyone's safety!
- Will notify parents with information as soon as we are able to safely do so.

We strongly suggest that you take a picture of this page with your cell phone so that in the event you hear we are in an emergency procedure or receive such a call, you can quickly reference the terms to know what is taking place. We would further suggest that you keep this page for future reference.



Staff Qualifications

Pursuant to the No Child Left Behind Act, parents may request information about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teachers including whether the teacher has State certification for the classes being taught; the teacher's bachelor's degree major and any other certifications or degrees by field or discipline; and whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications. Homeless Student Policy

All programs and services of the district are available to homeless students and unaccompanied youth. Whenever a homeless child or unaccompanied youth seeks to enroll in the district, and at least twice annually, while the child is enrolled, the parent and child will be informed of their rights. Some of these rights include the right to attend the school they previously attended or to attend school in the district of current location, the right to be enrolled even though the admission requirements have not been completed and prior student records are not available, and the right to transportation to and from school.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), a Federal law, requires that the Ellicottville Central School District, with certain exceptions, obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, the Ellicottville Central School District may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the District to the contrary in accordance with District procedures. The primary purpose of directory information is to all the Ellicottville Central School District to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications.

Examples may include:

- a playbill, showing your student's role in a drama production;
- the annual yearbook;

- · honor roll or other recognition lists;
- graduation programs; and
- sports activity sheets, showing weight and height of team members.

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks.

In addition, two federal laws require local educational agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories - names, addresses

If you do not want the Ellicottville Central School District to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the District in writing by September 30, 2021. Asbestos Containing Materials

In compliance with Sections 763.85 and .93 of the asbestos-containing materials in school's rule, all facilities owned, leased or operated by the Ellicottville Central School District have been inspected for the presence of asbestos-containing building materials. Asbestos management plans have been developed for all facilities and submitted to the NYS Education Department. The E.P.A. requires re-inspections every three (3) years by an accredited asbestos inspector. This re-inspection was done in October 2019, and the results were reviewed by an accredited management planner. The 2019 re-inspection found no significant changes in the condition of the asbestos-containing materials. In general, the asbestos materials in the district are in good condition and will continue to be managed as recommended by the accredited management planner. Copies of the management plans are available for public inspection requests should be made to the Marc Waters, Maintenance Supervisor, at 716-699-2316 (ext. 1404).

Sex Offender Registry Website

The purpose of this site is to provide an overview of the sex offender registration law and how the public can obtain information about sex offenders. The Sex Offender Registration Act, New York's version of Megan's Law, was signed by Governor George E. Pataki in July 1995 and became effective on January 21, 1996. The text of the statute is contained in Correction Law Article 6-C (Section 168 et seq.).

Registered sex offenders in New York are classified by the risk of reoffense. A court determines whether an offender is a level 1 (low risk), 2 (moderate risk) or 3 (high risk). The court also determines whether an offender should be given the designation of a sexual predator, sexually violent offender or predicate sex offender. Sex offenders registered on or after March 11, 2002 register for a minimum of 10 years unless they have been given a designation. If they have been given a designation, they are registered for life.

Level 1 and 2 sex offenders registered prior to March 11, 2002 register for 10 years while level 3 offenders register for life. For more information on sex offenders residing in our district, please visit the following web address: **www.criminaljustice.state.ny.us**



ADVANCE CHILD TAX CREDIT

Together with AASA, our national affiliate, we encourage you to join with government agencies, community organizations, and other partners to help raise awareness about the Advance Child Tax Credit, part of the federal American Rescue Plan.

Starting on July 15 and through the rest of this calendar year, payments will be made monthly at \$250 per child between 6-17 years old or \$300 per child under 6 years old. All working families will get the full credit if they make up to \$150,000 for a couple or \$112,500 for a family with a single parent head of household.

Experts estimate that the credit has the potential to help cut the national child poverty rate by half.

If families filed their 2020 taxes this year or filed 2019 taxes last year, or used the IRS "Non-Filer Portal" to get a stimulus check last year, they will not need to do anything. If they did not file taxes in the last two years they can use the IRS Non-Filer tool (link below).

Schools can play a critical role in helping ensure that the people who need this the most will apply, so that all children can benefit.

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
