# **Cleaning and disinfecting musical instruments**

*For all instruments*: Open the case and let it "air out" for 2-3 days, without touching anything inside. Make sure this is in a place safe from pets, water damage, etc.

#### <u>Flutes</u>:

Head joint: Swab the inside with cleaning rod and cloth swab, wipe down lip plate with alcohol swab. <u>Main body & foot joint</u>: Swab the inside with cleaning rod and cloth swab. <u>Swab</u>: Hand wash swab with warm, soapy water, rinse well; hang to dry.

#### Clarinet/Saxophone/Oboe:

<u>Mouthpieces</u>: Let top of mouthpiece (not cork part of clarinet mouthpiece) sit in a mixture of half vinegar, half lukewarm water. (The mouthpiece is made out of hard plastic or rubber, so only use lukewarm water; very hot water will discolor the mouthpiece.) Then clean with soap and water, and a small brush may be used to scrub the inside of the mouthpiece. (There is a special brush available for this if you're interested in purchasing one) *Be careful not to get the cork of the clarinet mouthpiece wet*.

<u>Reeds</u>: Cane reeds should be replaced; plastic reeds can be washed with warm soapy water <u>Main body</u>: Swab the inside with silk swab.

Swab: Hand wash swab with warm, soapy water, rinse well; hang to dry

#### Trumpets/French Horns/Trombones/Tuba:

<u>Mouthpieces</u>: Clean with soap and water. You can also use a small brush to clean the inside of the mouthpiece. <u>Towel/washcloth</u>: Wash in the washing machine or by hand with warm, soapy water. Put in dryer hang to dry.

#### Percussion:

Sticks/Mallets: Wipe down with sanitizing wipe.

#### Cases:

Spray inside and outside of case with a disinfecting spray, then let air dry, ideally in the sun. Make sure that the case is completely dry before putting instrument back in.

## NO OTHER PART OF THE INSTRUMENTS SHOULD BE CLEANED IN WATER!
